It may take a little time for us all to remember this change. So, please stay seated if there is a queue forming and you find it difficult to stand for periods.

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The readings for this Sunday astound us by the sheer nature of God. In the readings we encounter the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Jesus speaks of sharing with us the love He has received from His Father; Jesus says that He has


shared with us everything He has learned from His Father. When Jesus says that, "a man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for this friends", Jesus is sharing with us the essence of the eternal relationship He has with the Father in the Spirit. Love is, God is, the eternal the laying down of Oneself for the Other. Jesus speaks of the joy He knows, for eternal love, eternal self-giving for the Other is eternal joy. Father and Son, in the bond of the Holy Spirit, delight in giving all for the Other. This is the eternal life of God, without beginning or end.

At the dawn of time, of creation, God, in Their eternal wisdom, conceived of creatures who would be able to think about, respond to, freely choose to follow God, to be friends with God in God's love, all this is only possible through our rational souls. As the eternal love of God is without any darkness, any sin, any corruption, the first human sin from our human parents wounded human nature, wounded the relationship between God and man. But as Love essentially reaches out to the other in service and generosity, God never abandons His creatures. The Lord longs for all His rational creatures to reenter into His eternal love.

And so the sacrifice of His eternal Son, Jesus, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, fulfils and exceeds all the Old Testament sacrifices for sin with His limitless power and goodness. Jesus, Who is Love incarnate, offers to all Who will accept Him, Who will accept His personal sacrifice for our sins, His love. This love is the life of God and the life of heaven. This is why Saint John writes, "God's love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only Son, so that we could have life through him". It is God's love that is our Life-Blood, our Food, and we must be healed, transformed, made anew, divinised by it. Jesus is the Vine, we need the holy sap from His Vine to grow as part of the one true Vine. Think how Saint John the Baptist says, "He (Jesus) must increase I must decrease" (Jn 3:30). Saint John the Baptist is realising that only in the grace, only in the love of Jesus can we receive the Way that saves, be grafted onto the Vine.

The Psalm sings, "the Lord has made known his salvation; has shown his justice to the nations. He has remembered his truth and his love for the house of Israel". This reflects how the love of God, made possible for us only through Jesus' sacrifice upon the Cross, is offered to all nations, all peoples. The first reading from Acts shows how stunned the Jews are when they realise that the love of God, lavished upon us through Jesus, by the Holy Spirit, is being offered to the Gentiles, too. Saint Peter is flabbergasted that the Spirit has given them gifts to the same extent that they received at the first Pentecost. This gratuitousness of God, reaches out to all peoples and reflects the eternal communion, the eternal friendship of the three divine persons – God – and so we, thus filled to overflowing with this living love, are to love others with this same love. And so we are, "to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last" (Jn 15:16). May all peoples discover their eternal need for the love of Jesus Christ and share this with others.
