

ST GEORGE'S DAY!

St George is patron of many countries, including: Georgia; Greece; Palestine, Turkey, ...also of: Catalonia, soldiers, princesses, refugees, victims, prisoners, horses and animals, ending conflict ...and England!

Our novena concludes on Monday evening (22nd), then we begin his Octave. We are going to have 8 days of celebrating our National Saint. On

Wednesday 24th April, we shall have a special Mass in his honour and then party in the hall. (Please speak to Rosemary from the UCM or Alex McGee from the KSC or email

whitton@rcdow.org.uk if you would like to help with this party). Children are welcome to dress as St George (Soldier, Martyr, man of prayer) or as the Princess he saved; or his heroic horse; St Joan of Arc is also welcome. (Maybe not dragons)

ICON OF ST RAPHAEL ARCHANGEL

The **Holy Book of Tobit** is only 14 short chapters. If you have never read it, perhaps read it one day this week.

We have a new picture inspired by the book of Tobit. Here we see how the **Archangel Raphael** guides Tobias on his way. Essentially, this scripture teaches us that bad things happen to good people, but God has a plan and He sends His holy angels to help us. We in turn are also called to help others (to pray and to give charity). In our new picture, we see the Archangel Raphael guiding Tobias as he journeys to 'Media' (today called Jordan / Saudi Arabia).

(Tobit 5:4) 'So Tobias went out to look for a man to go with him to Media [Jordan], someone who was acquainted with the way. He went out and found the angel Raphael standing in front of him; but he did not perceive that he was an angel of God.'

We also see a dog in the painting (but not in the bible!) - a dog usually represents loyalty, courage and companionship, (and long walks!). The houses in the background are typical Arabian houses (with flat roofs to enjoy the evening sun). When we pray to the guardian angels and the great Archangels, perhaps, we might also pray for Christians in the Middle East, in Jordan and in the Holy Land, who are persecuted daily for the True Catholic Faith and the Holy Name of Jesus.

ICON OF THE ANNUNCIATION

In this painting, we see **Gabriel** the Angel of the Lord declares unto Mary that she is chosen to be the Mother of God. Our Lady totally agrees and says 'be it done unto me, according to your word!' And God the Father sends forth the Holy Spirit and she conceived Christ by the Holy Spirit. (*See Lk 1:26-1:38*)

In the background, we see Adam and Eve leaving the Garden of Eden, as a result of their unfaithfulness and unrepentance. *However*, we also see in this painting how God the Blessed Trinity already had a plan to welcome mankind back into paradise many generations later (*see Gen 3:1-24*). So in Our Lady, Virgin Most Humble and Most Faithful, at last God finds someone who always says "Yes!" to God's plan and is totally open to His Mercy and Love. Our Lady is now called the New Eve.

Our Lady is the perfect Christian who teaches us how to welcome the Holy Spirit.

REGINA CAELI

Throughout Eastertide, instead of the Angelus, we stand and pray to Our Lady, saying:

Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia!

For He, whom you did merit to bear, alleluia!

Has risen as He said, alleluia!

Pray for us to God, alleluia!

Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.

For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

O God, Who gave joy to the world through the Resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

We sing this same prayer in Latin after each Holy Mass:

Regina caeli, laetare, alleluia! Quia quem meruisti portare, alleluia! Resurrexit, sicut dixit, alleluia! Ora pro nobis Deum, alleluia!

ST MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

Holy Michael the Archangel, defend us in this Day of battle. Be our safe-guard against the wickedness and snares of the devil; May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; And do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host, and by the power of God, thrust down into hell Satan and all evil spirits who prowl through this world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us. Our Lady of Walsingham, pray for us. St Edmund, pray for us.

'BUT A PRIEST IS ONLY BUSY ON A SUNDAY MORNING, RIGHT?'

Some people genuinely think a priest only serves on a Sunday morning and then he is free for the week. So here is a snap-shot of a typical day of a celibate Diocesan Priest. (Monks in monasteries, and Religious Friars, and Priests who are also teachers/ doctors/etc, they have a different routine).

Mondays to Fridays

6am - wake up /

Breakfast / Matins & personal prayer.

7am - open church

8am - adoration

8.45am - Morning Prayer

9.15am - Holy Mass (20-40 people come to this Mass)

10am - meeting in the office about church building

11am - visiting sick / meeting parishioners

1pm - lunch (and midday prayer)

2pm - visiting sick / care-homes

5pm - meetings with parish people / signing forms

6pm - Evening Prayers ('Vespers')

7pm - lock church

7.10pm emails and admin & update the website 8pm supper

9pm Study time (I'm learning ancient Hebrew; and studying the scriptures)

10pm / 11pm night prayers and sleep.

Of course, I also try to visit the retired priests; school visits; care-home visits; meeting with local priests; on-going training (for all the legal policies for running: halls, churches and charities). I regularly meet with non-Catholic church leaders for Ecumenical dialogue.

Sometimes there are unexpected things, like emergency Last Rites; urgent Confessions / Anointing; funerals and burials. (This week there are 3 funerals in our parish)

On Saturdays, we have baptisms (last Saturday we had 2 baptisms); weddings; meetings with parish groups; house blessings etc.

Also a priest must say his Rosary and Divine Mercy devotions, praying for peace in the world.

On an average weekday, I meet with around two hundred people. On a weekend, I meet at least 1,000 people (Mass count for the 4 Sunday Masses of Sun 1st Oct 2023 was 810 people, and our numbers are going up – thank God!).

So, the priestly life is certainly not lonely!! The priestly life is wonderful.

Thank you for all your support and prayers.

As Jesus said to St Peter and the Apostles: "Everyone who has left houses, family or land for My sake will be repaid 100 times over and inherit eternal life!" (Mt19:29)
