The Destruction of the Temple foretold (Lk 21:5-19)

Meditation: How would you respond if someone prophesied that your home, land, or place of worship would be destroyed? Jesus foretold many signs that would shake peoples and nations. The signs which God uses are meant to point us to a higher spiritual truth and reality of his kingdom which does not perish or fade away, but endures for all eternity. God works through many events and signs to purify and renew us in hope and to help us set our hearts more firmly on him and him alone.

We do not need to fear our adversaries

What will attract others to the truth and power of the Gospel? When they see Christians loving their enemies, being joyful in suffering, patient in adversity, pardoning injuries, and showing comfort and compassion to the hopeless and the helpless. Jesus tells us that we do not need to fear our adversaries. God will give us sufficient grace, strength, and wisdom to face any trial and to answer any challenge to our faith. Are you ready to lay down your life for Christ and to bear witness to the joy and freedom of the Gospel?

Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, by your atoning death on the cross you have redeemed the world. Fill me with joyful hope, courage, and boldness to witness the truth of your love for sinners and your victory over the powers of sin, Satan, and death.

Remembrance Sunday

The minute's silence on Remembrance Day this Sunday probably can't match that emotion for most of us. Yet the invitation to reflect is the same and, here too, silence is a fitting medium.



A minute is barely enough time for the chatter of our minds to begin to settle. All the same, Remembrance Sunday is an invitation to find a space in our hurried lives for a silent opening to all that war has meant for the country. For all of us, it is a national meditation on what Wilfred Owen called 'the truth untold / the pity of war, the pity war distilled.'

Attending to that untold truth requires that we become quiet, for just a moment, and bear witness to what happened. We don't need to figure it out or think how to put it right. Then what? I think Owen's word 'pity' is a clue, and 'compassion' is another. We can't force compassion into existence any more than we can force a flower to grow. But if we sit quietly in those silent moments like in any sport event, shopping centre, TV news or on Remembrance Sunday, perhaps compassion will emerge; and, with it, a sense of what to do next.

The Holy Father's Prayer Intention for November 2022. For children who suffer: We pray for children who are suffering, especially those who are homeless, orphans, and victims of war; may they be guaranteed access to education and the opportunity to experience family affection.

World Day of the Poor. Today Sunday 13 November is the sixth World Day of the Poor, with the theme of "For your sakes Christ became poor" (2 Cor 8:9). Pope Francis, in his message for the day, laments that just as the world was emerging from the "tempest of the pandemic", a new catastrophe appeared on the horizon: the Russian invasion of Ukraine and the brutal war which has followed. The war has displaced millions of Ukrainian people causing global economic turbulence, food shortages and rising energy costs which will affect the poorest this winter.

Operation Elf is the campaign by *PACT*, the Prison Advice and Care Trust, to enable prisoners to give a Christmas gift to their child. This year they are asking supporters to buy a gift card with a £15 value only. If you want to donate more please buy multiples of £15 cards.
