DO YOU KNOW ANYONE WHO COULD BE A PRIEST?

Last week I had a message from a man asking to come and see me for a chat. I set time aside for him, and wondered what it was he wanted to speak to me about – a marriage? A sick friend? A theological conundrum? As it turned out, it was none of these things. He was a little bit nervous, but what he wanted to talk about was the fact that he felt that he might have a vocation to the priesthood. He said that this feeling had been with him for almost as long as he could remember, but that only recently had he been able to put it onto words. What helped him was a parishioner asking him if he wanted to be a priest. That spurred him on to come and see me.

This is the weekend when we think about and pray for more vocations to the priesthood. Here at St Mary Magdalen's we must pray especially for Deacon Francis Thomas, whom many of you know maybe since he was a boy in the parish. He recently had the good news that the Cardinal will ordain him a priest on 24th June at Westminster Cathedral. He will be saying his First Mass here in this church the next day, Sunday 25th June. To enable as many people to attend as possible, I am going to bring the 10:30am and the 12 noon Masses together, and Francis' Mass will be at 11:00am. This will be followed by a celebration lunch' at St Mary Magdalen's School, where he was a pupil. It will be a time of great rejoicing and thanksgiving for our parish.

The diocese needs more priests. When I was talking with the young man about priesthood, I told him it was a wonderful way of life, a way to serve God and bring His grace to the people of God. It's not without its problems, of course, but it is a great privilege to serve Christ and his church in this way.

What was key to encouraging this man was words from other parishioners suggesting he might have a vocation. If you know any young (or not so young) men who might have a vocation talk to them. Pray for them. It is from parishes like this one that vocations come.

Exhibition: St Francis of Assisi. The National Gallery is holding an exhibition from 6 May to 30 July 2023 exploring the life and legacy of St Francis of Assisi. Curated by the National Gallery's Director, Dr Gabriele Finaldi, and Dr Joost Joustra, the Gallery's Curator in Art and Religion, the exhibition will include paintings by Botticelli, Sassetta, Caravaggio, Murillo, El Greco, and Antony Gormley as well as a new commission from Richard Long.
