

It is a favourite show among the burglars in His Majesty's Prisons, and I enjoy it a lot as well. It is, of course, very interesting to hear about the provenance and skill of a particular antique, but I think the bit everyone (especially the burglars) is interested in is how much it is worth. Last Sunday, Fiona Bruce was taking us through various sorts of pearl, which, I learned, can come from many sorts of gastropod, not just the oyster – sea snails and clams can also make them. She showed us some so-called flaming pearls, the final one was called a Melo Melo dragon pearl, and it weighed 100 carats. The expert told Fiona that there were only ten like this is the world – and its value was an astonishing £200,000.

Pearls are intensely beautiful, and have been valued for centuries. Their value and lustre would have been known by all who heard about them. In the first two of today's parables, Jesus has moved from the soil and the sea to the world of treasure. He is inviting people to contemplate what is most valuable. In the second, he speaks of a merchant who has an idea of what he searching for, finds it (maybe a Melo Melo pearl) and sacrifices everything he has to purchase it.

This parable of Jesus is about searching, finding and sacrificing. If we do these things, then we will find the kingdom of heaven, the place of fulfilment and love. It is part of human nature to search – I am sure you all know people, young and old, who are searching for something in their lives. You may well be searching yourself. To find Jesus is to find what you are searching for – he is the Way, the Truth and the Life. But, to stay true to Jesus and his kingdom will require sacrifice, will require giving things up. The merchant found his pearl, and sold everything he had to buy it. For many of us, to follow Jesus will mean living in a different way, having different priorities. In a world which is increasingly about self-fulfilment, self-identification and self-care, the call of Jesus is to look beyond self. There are values which are greater than us; there are values which call us to look beyond our own needs – when we sacrifice our needs to those of others, then we will find true treasure, then we will have the pearl of great value.
