AWAY IN A MANGER

Last Sunday morning members of our Youth Group and adult helpers made our way to deepest, darkest Surrey. We were going to see 'The Wintershall Nativity.' I had been recommended it by a friend, but, as we crawled around the M25 in the minibus, I wondered whether it would be worth the effort.

My fears started to dispel when we arrived in the car park. To our left was a little hut with some real sheep in a pen. To be so near a sheep was, I am sure, a new experience for our city bred young people. We were in the open countryside, the wind blowing around us, but we soon got involved in the events of the Nativity unfolding before us. There were real people, real sheep, a real donkey and real horses. As we settled down in a huge barn to see the place where Jesus was born, I could hear a young child behind me asking her dad –'Will there be a real baby?' I think most of us were expecting a large doll to take the part of Jesus, but – wonder of wonders – there was indeed a real baby. It was extraordinary the difference that made to the whole experience. At the centre of the stage, there was that most vulnerable of beings – a tiny baby, looking around, blinking, and gurgling. This is Jesus Christ.

This real baby made so clear to me the miracle of the Incarnation. So much more than any painting or sculpture, so see a real baby in all his vulnerability focusses the heart and soul on the essence of this day. Jesus is not a distant, abstract idea, but a real flesh and blood baby born in Bethlehem.
