'Nothing says I love you quite like ash on your forehead'.

As perhaps we all know, Ash Wednesday is almost the earliest it can be, and this year it coincides with Valentine's Day. It was very good to see so many of you, including children and young people on half term, at the Ash Wednesday Masses. But maybe it was a day of rather mixed feelings. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (only one main meal) and abstinence (no meat). If you were planning a romantic evening, that might have made it a little less romantic than you'd hoped. So, how can we bring the two together?

Well, let's look at the symbolism of the ash first of all. It is imposed on our heads to mark the first day of the solemn season of Lent – forty days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These ashes are a visible sign of our mortality – we are dust and to dust we shall return – but they should also make us reflect on our immortality, that through Jesus Christ we shall gain immortality, eternal life with God. When the ash is put on our forehead, it is placed in the form of a cross and this is a sign to us of God's unfailing love for us – the ash on our forehead indeed does say 'I love you'.

I suspect that those who sent a Valentine's card were hoping that there would be some sort of response, even though it may have been sent without a name. Most of us have known at some time in our lives the agony of a love which has no response from the other person. The three duties of Lent — **prayer**, **fasting** and **almsgiving**, should be our response to the love which God shows us - make these things the heart of your response to God this Lent.

- ♦ You might meditate on the Stations of the Cross; use more regularly a devotional app on your 'phone; come to an extra weekday Mass if you're able come a bit earlier to Mass. As a family, make prayer before meals a true time of praying together.
- Fasting it doesn't seem so fashionable to say it these days, but yes Lent does mean giving up eating something you enjoy. It is such a simple way of uniting ourselves to the Redeemer. And, for some of us, it might mean giving up other things as well no Pointless (again) for me for the next 40 days.
- If you can, set some money aside to help others, you are such a generous parish, and Lent is a way to affirm that generosity. There is the Cardinal's Lent Appeal and also CAFOD.

May God bless us all as we start this holy season – the ash last Wednesday reminded us of his love for us on the cross, our Lenten resolutions are signs to God of our love for Him.
