Saturdays: 10:00am—10:30am 5:30pm— 6:15pm & At Call \*Livestreamed We have, indirectly, St Patrick to thank for the fact that we, as Catholics, can go to individual confession to a priest and thereby know the grace of sin forgiven. Nearly everyone knows that St Patrick brought the Catholic faith to Ireland. He first went there as a young man after being kidnapped by pirates. He returned years later as a priest and proclaimed the great truths of our faith. But what many people do not know is that what we know now as confession did not really exist in the early Christian era. It's a long story, but basically anyone who committed sin after baptism was not easily allowed back to the sacraments. There would be a life of penance and excommunication. By the seventh century it was clear this was not really working as it was intended to. People put off baptism until their deathbeds, rather than risk a life of penance following sin.

Irish monks developed a system of confession with the private recitation of sins which was followed by a private penance. It was they who, far from being fire and brimstone sort of Catholics, made penance more private and more merciful.

We are the inheritors of this grace which has come to the world wide Catholic church from Irish monks. We are now entering that time of year when our minds and souls turn to the suffering of Jesus, and we know that he suffered and died on the Cross to open up heaven for us.

Inspired by this, please make use of the sacrament of penance, reconciliation – or confession as it is often called – this Easter. It is the time of year when all Catholics should come to confession, seeking to rise from sin as Jesus Christ rose from death. There will be a Penitential Service at St Mary Magdalen's church at 7pm on Monday in Holy Week, 25<sup>th</sup> March There will be a reading of scripture, prayer and a chance to reflect on our lives and then time for individual confession to a priest. There will be six priests with us, the home team plus some visitors. You can choose whom to see.

I encourage you very much to come to this service. Of course, there will be other times for confession in both Kensal Rise and Willesden Green parishes if you cannot manage this time, but this will be our principal act of penance as a community before Easter.
